



Common Concerns from Public Involvement Activities

**Powerline Trail Phase 2
Project 2980-22-00
Cities of Greenfield and Milwaukee**

- 1. Location of the trail in relation to adjacent property owners' property lines and privacy.**
The Cities and designers are sensitive to these concerns and have aligned the trail generally down the middle of the 200-foot wide We Energies utility corridor. In locations where there are topographic obstacles or utility conflicts the trail is aligned as far away from adjacent private property as feasible.
- 2. Increase in crime and unauthorized motor vehicle use along the trail.**
Law enforcement will patrol the trail and enforce the relevant laws and regulations. Entrances to the trail will be clearly signed that motorized vehicles are not permitted.
- 3. Increase in pet waste and dogs are commonly off leash while using the trail.**
Signage, trash receptacles and pet waste stations will be considered as possible mitigations to these concerns.
- 4. Increase in noise within the corridor.**
Construction activities will cause a temporary increase in noise while the trail is being constructed, but no motorized vehicle traffic will be permitted on the trail and noise levels due to shared-use path users should be relatively low.
- 5. How will the trail be maintained in the future?**
The Cities will be responsible for future trail maintenance.
